Melbourne, the capital city of Victoria, is Australia's second-largest city and was recognised in 2021 as a global leader in innovative approaches to urban nature. In April 2017, the Future Melbourne Committee endorsed the City of Melbourne's Nature in the City Strategy – the councils first strategy to create and maintain healthy ecosystems and thriving biodiversity within the city that also addressed climate change adaption and net zero emissions ambitions. The vision for 'a city in a forest' is now championed by the Lord Mayor and has gained international prominence through various awards, including the 2014 C40 City Climate Leadership Award. This masterclass will give an overview of this groundbreaking work and outline implementation progress to date including lessons learnt and future challenges.
